

Dr. Danny Fong

Dr. Danny Fong was born and raised in New York City's Chinatown. A first-generation Chinese-American whose parents immigrated from China in the 1950s, he attended public schools and Stuyvesant High School before completing his undergraduate studies at Amherst College in 1982.

Dr. Fong received his medical degree from the University of Rochester School of Medicine. He then fulfilled his residencies and fellowships in General Surgery at New York Medical College, Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at Albany Medical Center and Hand Surgery at the Connecticut Combined Hand Program in Hartford.

Upon completion of his training, Dr. Fong returned to his roots in New York City's Chinatown in 1993 to open his private practice specializing in plastic, reconstructive and hand surgery. In addition to a diverse patient mix of all ages and backgrounds from across the New York City metro area, with a primary focus on the pediatric population, he still serves a contingent of older Chinese patients with whom he converses in dialects first taught to him by his grandmother. Dr. Fong currently serves on the board of the Asian American Accountable Care Organization and is the Immediate Past President of the Chinese American Medical Society. Dr. Fong resides in Brooklyn with his wife and four young children.
